I. CALL TO ORDER - GREG THOMPSON

1. Invocation

III. **PUBLIC FORUM**

1. Public Comments

No one signed up for public comments.

2. Public Hearing

a. Rezone - 110 Mears Street

Code Enforcement Officer Patrick Kelley presented the application for rezone of this property from R-2 to B-2. Mr. Kelley stated the property consists of 1.53 acres. The property has 366.54 feet of road frontage on Mears Street and 203 feet of road frontage on Radford Street. The Code Office and Planning Commission recommend the request be approved with the recommended condition to remove the temporary classroom trailers which front on Radford Street.

The Mayor declared the meeting open for the purpose of public input.

Reverend Tommy Fountain, Pastor of Grace Baptist Church, spoke in favor of the rezone. He stated the church is in the process of renovating the old Piggly Wiggly building in order to relocate to that location. He explained it would help the purchasers of the property at Mears Street to have it rezoned from R-2 to B-2.

There were no other public comments; Mayor Thompson declared that portion of the meeting closed.

To approve the rezone, with the condition that the trailers be removed.

b. Conditional Use - 110 Mears Street

Code Enforcement Officer Patrick Kelley presented the application for conditional use of this property to allow a private school. The applicant, Grace Baptist Church, is selling the property and the new buyer will use it for preschool education. The Code Office and Planning Commission recommend the request be approved.

IV. NEW BUSINESS

1. 2nd Reading – Airport Commission Ordinance Update

City Attorney Paul Rosenthal gave the second reading of the ordinance to amend Chapter 14, Article IV – Airport Commission.

3. Art Guild Roof and Renovations

City Administrator Logan Propes stated that the Art Guild has suffered for years from water leaks due to a failing roof. He explained that the funding for the roof repair will come from Prior Years' Reserves and from the residual of the Public Facilities Bond Fund.

To approve the roof repair at the Art Guild.

4. Subscribed Regulatory Compliance Service Second Amendment

City Administrator Logan Propes discussed the second amendment to the SRCS contract for the 2017 – 2018 plan year with MGAG. He explained that the amendment revises certain fee structures. The Subscribed Regulatory Compliance Service Program calculates the amount which the City must pay for compliance costs. He explained that the new fee structure will save the City \$3,662.86, based on current service levels and meter counts. The total cost of the amended contract will be \$18,756.00 versus the previous total of \$22,418.36.

To approve the Subscribed Regulatory Compliance Service Second Amendment.
